IMPROVING EDUCATION

- Debo helped secure £1.6 million which helped Tavistock College, St. Peter's and St. Rumon's in Tavistock.
- Debo found funding for local schools towards the cost of allotments, bike sheds and play equipment.
- Debo worked with school governors to get flashing school signs erected at St. Rumon's.
- Debo has worked with the police and highway engineers on safety issues relating to the roads near Gulworthy primary School
- Debo worked with the tutors at Tavistock College to organise a "Political Speed Dating" event where pupils met councillors from a variety of parties and asked them questions about local government. It is hoped this will become an annual event and will promote community cohesion.

Improving services for local people

With 30 years of nursing experience, Debo was a natural choice to be appointed as Vice Chairman of the Adult Health & Wellbeing Scrutiny Committee when first elected to County Hall.

Being pro-active and down to earth, Debo demonstrated influence where office centric decision makers didn't necessarily grasp the realities of frontline health care delivery.

Public health will soon be the responsibility of local government, Tavistock and Devon are fortunate to have Debo's experience in health related issues.

Having worked at Tavistock Hospital, Debo realises that car parking is difficult for users and frustrating for Watt's Road residents. Debo is keen to ensure our local hospital is there to serve future generations and has been a driving force to make sure that adequate car parking provision will be introduced.

Debo has worked tirelessly alongside representatives of the local Disabled groups to make access and mobility around the Tavistock area easier including finding funding to upgrade the TASS community buses and other voluntary transport providers.
